June is Gay & Lesbian Pride Month

Did you know

- ⇒ This awareness is in honor of the 1969 Stonewall Riots in Manhattan?
- ⇒ The celebrations encompass everything from parades and parties to concerts nationwide.
- ⇒ In 1998, President Clinton issued the Executive Order 13087 that expanded the equal employment opportunity to include sexual orientation as a prohibited discrimination.
- ⇒ In 2009, President Obama issued Proclamation No. 8387 declaring June as Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender Pride Month.
- ⇒ On April 18, 2013 the definition of "partner" in the Montana Code Annotated 45-5-206 is changed to include relationships that are also same sex couples.

Research has shown that domestic violence rates are similar in same sex relationships as they are in opposite sex relationships. The lack of legal recognition of same sex relationships is just one of the barriers that are preventing victims in the LGBT community from receiving appropriate services. The change in Montana Codes to include same sex couples in the statute of Partner Family Member Assaults is a large step in the right direction.

Did you also know...

⇒ A batterer in a gay/lesbian relationship may use the threat of "outing" their partner to family/friends who do not know as a form of control. These creates a heightened level of isolation from friends, family, law enforcement, and diminishing civil legal rights.

- ⇒ Victims in the LGBT community may feel afraid to come forward about the abuse for fear of judgment by law enforcement when revealing sexual orientation, or by feeling ashamed in breaking the "solidarity" of the LGBT community; afraid that society will use this as a reason to label same sex relationships as inherently dysfunctional.
- ⇒ Gay and lesbian victims are more likely to fight back than are heterosexual women victims, which may lead law enforcement to mistaken domestic violence as a mutual fight, and therefore dismissing the core of the violence.
- ⇒ In places where adoption is not allowed by same sex parents, the threat of taking away children a victim may not have biological/ legal rights to is another form of heightened control.

In June, Safe Space advocates are attending training opportunities and cross training information that help our program to better serve the LGBT community.

It is important for all persons victimized in a domestic or sexual assault to know that Safe Space advocates provide the same services to all, without discrimination and without judgment.
