Safe Space

History in the Making

Over the last 2 years, Safe Space has been exploring new locations and expansion options for the shelter program. In 2014, with over 1200 shelter nights and over 225 victims served, it became apparent that this trend of increased requests for services was not going to slow down.

Under the direction of past Executive Director, Sarah Weber, renovations to the current confidential shelter facility appeared to be a viable option. After much research and communication, this was shown to be a temporary quick fix for a short term period. It was during the transition of directors and with the guidance of of, with the ability to serve all victhe Safe Space Board of Directors that other choices were explored. Safe Space looked at the options

of building new on available prop-

erty to meet the specific and unique needs of a domestic violence and sexual assault program as well as existing buildings available throughout Butte. At a time when it felt as if no viable and financially suitable option was available, Safe Space was approached by the Board of Directors of the Paul Clark Foundation to discuss the option of the Paul Clark Home.

Safe Space has had the goal of transitioning into a larger facility that could function as a public and highly secured facility for all services and volunteerism. After only one tour it became apparent that Safe Space had found the space it was in need tims in one location, including those with the need for handicap accessibility, and to include male victims.

Safe Space was located in its previ-

ous facility for nearly 40 years. When a shelter facility became available in the late 70's to provide safety to victims, history was made. Safe Space is excited to again be making history in Butte by transitioning into a facility with strong ties to our rich history, and to have the opportunity to provide additional services in a calming and welcoming environment.

Safe Space invites any persons who has been involved with the Safe Space (formerly known as the Butte Christian Center) from its start in the early 70's, to its incorporation in 1980, and into the 21st century to contact our Executive Director. New Opportunities and Assistance

As the sirens become silent and the bruises begin to surface, the victim is overwhelmed by a new fear: a fear of the future.

Becoming a survivor does not happen in one step. There is much planning and even more support that comes with each new goal set by a victim who has escaped violence.

Once safety is reached, a plan for the future begins. Childcare for young children in the home. Counseling services to address trauma and learn and exercise healthy coping skills. Suitable housing for an individual or a family. And the ability to be financial secure to provide for all the future brings.

Becoming financially independent and secure after domestic violence can be difficult for many reasons. Some victims have not been allowed to work outside of the home in many years. Some have worked but have not had access to family funds. And some have even lost employment due to events that are caused by the domestic violence they have endured.

Safe Space provides assistance

with budgeting, referrals to credit counselors and programs, provides referrals to Career Futures, assists with employment resumes and applications, job searches, and financial responsibilities.

In 2015, Safe Space is proud to have been selected as one of less than 200 programs nation-wide to participate in the All-State Purple Purse Challenge. The Purple Purse Challenge is an opportunity for the communities we serve to become directly involved with the domestic violence program in their local area by raising funds and awareness surrounding domestic violence and financial empowerment.

At this time, Safe Space is looking for person who are interested on a volunteer basis to join a committee that would lead this challenge in our service area. Planning includes marketing, public media, website and social media, one-on-one meetings, and a lot of fun along the way! Implementation will include planned activities from October 1st-October 27th, 2015.

In 2014, programs were able to raise between \$70,000 and over \$400,000! Help to put Butte Montana on the map by making our opportunity to be a part of the Purple Purse Challenge a success!
